#### **ACTION STEPS FOR ABSENCES/TARDIES:**

Unexcused absence/tardies will affect a student's academic performance and are subject to the following interventions:

- Step 1 3 absences/tardies (unexcused)

  Notification letter will be sent home by teacher
- Step 2 7 absences/tardies (unexcused/excused)
- Notification will be sent home by Vice Principal **Step 3** 10 absences/tardies (unexcused/excused)
- Notification letter for Parent Conference w/Principal
- **Step 4** School may file an educational neglect petition with Family Court
