This year we are honored and privileged to implement the Jesse Lewis Choose Love Movement. This program is a social and emotional learning curriculum that includes lessons that incorporate important character values such as courage, gratitude, forgiveness, and compassion. The movement also focuses on cultivating optimism, resiliency, and personal responsibility.

Learning these core values helps students achieve academic and personal success through: better self awareness and management skills, social awareness, improved relationship skills, responsible decision making skills, enhanced self control, and positive intention.

Students will have fun gaining a deeper understanding of their brain and how it works.

They become familiar with the neuroscience behind brain functions to learn the benefits of promoting character traits. Students will learn to apply the concepts and strategies to make connections between their brains and their bodies.

Each grade level is aligned with the common core state standards and the American School Counselor Association (ASCA) Mindsets and Behaviors for Student Success. Students will learn the Choose Love Formula: Courage + Gratitude + Forgiveness + Compassion in Action = Choose Love Formula.

The major message with our newly implemented program is that: "We can't choose what happens to us, we can only choose how to respond in every situation."

ASBESTOS STATUS REPORT

The Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) requires our school to notify the faculty, staff, and parents of the presence and status of asbestos containing materials in our school building. The law further requires a management plan based upon the findings of the initial inspection.

We conducted the required six months surveillance in June 2017 and will complete the next surveillance in December 2017. the results of the recently completed surveillance indicate there have been no changes in the condition of the asbestos containing materials in our school buildings.
