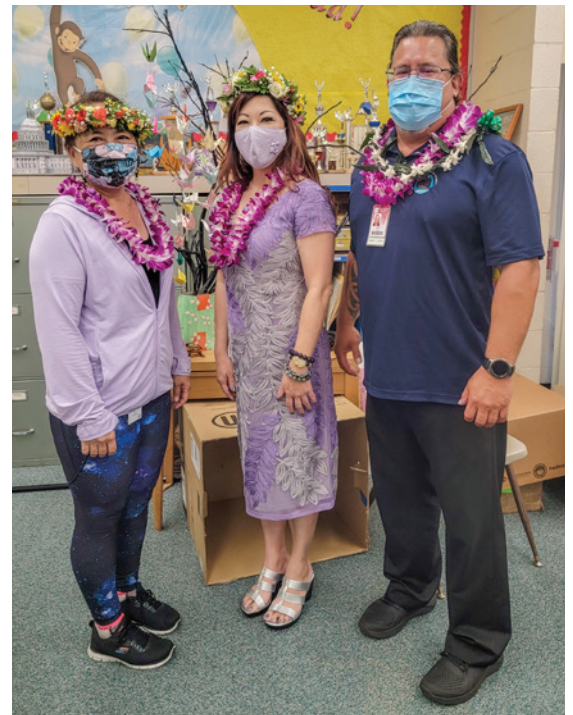


## A Fond Farewell
